What to do: Romantic Christmas Market



The romantic **Christmas market** around Bad Homburg castle opens on Friday, 29th November. Following the shining stars from Schlossplatz up to Bad Homburg's landmark, the White Tower in the upper castle courtyard, you will find lots of traditional arts and crafts from local and regional exhibitors. Specialisties are also served alongside the classics such as sausage, tarte flambée, crêpes and mulled wine. The little steam train, which is not only a favorite for the little ones, will once again be rolling through a small winter forest against the magical Taunus backdrop this year.

How to get there: Ten-minute walk through the festively decorated pedestrian zone





The impressive Kaiser-Wilhelms-Bad, built in 1890, had already been visited by Prince Albert and former Reich Chancellor Otto von Bismarck. Where to go: Bad Homburg Castle and the White Tower



Bad Homburg Castle was the residence of the Landgraves of Hesse-Homburg and the summer residence of the Prussian King and German Emperor Wilhelm II. The castle owes its towering white tower to Landgrave Friedrich II. He had the castle built from 1679 to 1686 on a 14th century keep after having the medieval Hohenburg demolished down to its foundations. How to get there: A 10-minute-walk through the pedestrian zone and main street.

Where to taste healing waters: Bad Homburg Kurpark (Spa Gardens)



Bad Homburg was and still is famous for its numerous healing springs. These springs, which are accessible to everyone and from which pure water with a health-boosting composition gushes forth, were created in the Homburg Kurpark as early as 1857. The garden artist Peter Joseph Lenné created an idyllic park landscape with the fountain avenue, the orangery and the fountain basin as focal points. Opposite the orangery and directly behind the Elisabethenbrunnen fountain, an open drinking hall and a palm house were also built. This was followed in 1914 by a rather unusual building at the intersection of the two visual axes of the fountain district: Bad Homburg's first Thai sala.

How to get there: Your hotel is facing the park.



What to do in the evening: Visit "The Mother of Monte Carlo"



With its 175-year history, **Spielbank Bad Homburg** is one of the oldest and most famous casinos in Europe and is known far beyond the borders of Bad Homburg. Even today, it is still associated with Bad Homburg as its home town, whose history can be traced back to the year 782. Compared to the city, the Bad Homburg casino is still very "young", having been founded in May 1841 by François Blanc and his twin brother Louis. The Spielbank Restaurant Le Blanc combines elegant dining with modern Club&Dancing in the adjescent Casino lounge.
